Gold ornaments worth Rs 3 Cr, cash seized in Kabirdham

Chhattisgarh Police on Thursday seized gold ornaments weighing 4.7 kg and unaccounted cash from two persons in Kabirdham district.

The police seized gold ornaments worth Rs 3 crore and Rs 8.40 lakh in cash from Umashankar Sahu and Naveen Thakur Javed Jiواني, Kabirdham Superintendent of Police Dharmendra Singh Chhawai said.

The duo hailed from Raipur city. The police inter-

cepted a car at the interstate check post in the Kawardha police station limits following a tip.

A search led the police to 4.7 kg gold ornaments totaling Rs 3 crore besides Rs 8.40 lakh in cash from the vehicle.

The men failed to give a satisfactory reply about the ornaments and money.

The police seized the jewellery, money and a car used in the crime.

Also, the Income Tax and GST authorities were informed about the seizure.

AFRC imposes penalty on three pvt medical institutions

The Admission and Fees Regulatory Committee (AFRC) of Chhattisgarh on Thursday imposed hefty fines on three private medical institutions for allegedly overcharging fees for mess, bus, and hostel facilities.

The committee has imposed a fine of Rs 10 lakh each on Balaji Institute of Medical Science (Mowa, Raipur) and Raipur Institute Medical Science (Bhansoj, Raipur) and Shankaracharya Institute of Medical Science (Junwani, Bhilai).

Besides, the committee has directed to refund the additional amount to the students with 7 percent annual interest within a month.

The committee has also recommended the state government to cancel the affiliation of these medical institutions if they failed to deposit the penalty within the given time frame.

The Balaji Institute of Medical Science had overcharged the highest amount of Rs 4.58 lakh while Raipur Institute Medical Science took Rs 4.53 lakh and Shankaracharya Institute of Medical Science had taken Rs 4.43 lakh additional amount from the students.

39 doctors get contractual appointment

Common gut bacteria can make diabetes, cancer drugs less effective: Study

Common gut bacteria can metabolise some oral medications potentially rendering these important drugs against migraines, depression, type 2 diabetes, and prostate cancer less effective, according to a study on Thursday.

Researchers from the University of Pittsburgh and Yale University in the US showed that gut bacteria metabolises oral drugs that target cellular receptors called GPCRs.

Drugs that act on GPCRs, or G protein-coupled receptors, include more than 400 medications approved by the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for the treatment of many common conditions such as migraines, depression, type 2 diabetes, prostate cancer, and more.

“Understanding how GPCR-targeted drugs interact with human gut micro-

biota is critical for advancing personalised medicine initiatives,” said Qihao Wu, Assistant Professor at the Pitt School of Pharmacy.

“This research could help open up new avenues for drug design and therapeutic optimisation to ensure that treatments work better and safer for every individual,” Wu said.

The effectiveness of a drug varies from person to person, influenced by age, genetic makeup, diet and other factors.

Recently, researchers discovered that microbes in the gut can also metabolise orally administered drugs. It breaks down the compounds into different chemical structures which then alters the drugs' efficacy.

To learn more about which gut bacteria metabolises which drugs, the team built a synthetic microbial community composed of 30 common bacterial strains

found in the human gut.

In the lab study, they added each of the 127 GPCR-targeting drugs individually to tubes containing the bacteria.

The experiment showed that the bacterial mix metabolised 30 of the 127 tested drugs, 12 of which were heavily metabolised. This meant that concentrations of the original drug were greatly depleted because they were transformed into other compounds.

Overall, the findings, published in the journal Nature Chemistry, suggest that “specific gut bacteria could make GPCR-targeting drugs less effective by transforming them into other compounds,” the team said. The team urged for more research to understand the potential impact in people and that patients shouldn't stop taking or, change their medication without consulting their provider.

Elephant kills man in Balrampur

A 35-year-old man was trampled to death by a wild elephant on Thursday in Balrampur district of Chhattisgarh.

The incident took place in Ghaghra village when the victim, identified as Mahendra Gond, and three other villagers went to monitor their crops in fields, Balrampur Divisional Forest Officer Ashok Tiwari said.

The elephant caught hold of the man with its trunk and trampled him to death, the official said, adding that other villagers managed to escape after sensing the presence of the jumbo.



Forest and police personnel reached the spot and sent the body for post-mortem, he said.

The kin of the deceased was provided an instant relief amount of Rs 25,000.
